**First Station To Sell Gas By The Liter**

North Carolina now has a gas station that is selling gasoline by the liter, which is a little more than a quart.

The 301 Service Station in Enfield has converted its pumps to liter pricing, and officials of the N.C. Oil Jobbers Association say that other stations will soon follow throughout the state.

The reason for the change is that conventional gas pumps cannot handle prices above \$1 a gallon, and it is cheaper to alter the gearing to sell by the liter than to change the mechanism for prices above \$1.
