Barbara Gunter, sister-in-law of the bride, kept the bride's book.

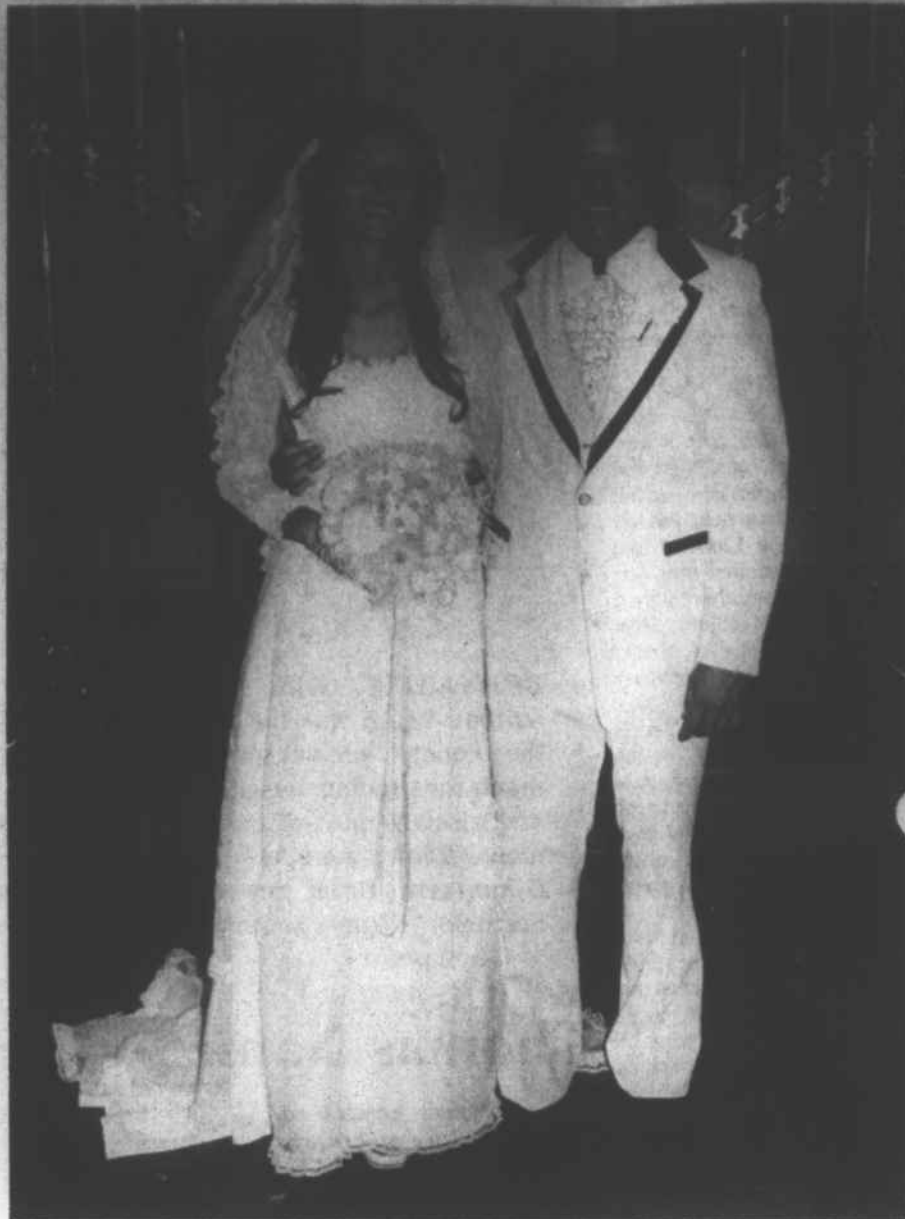
Barbara Penland, pianist, presented a program of wedding music prior to the ceremony.
