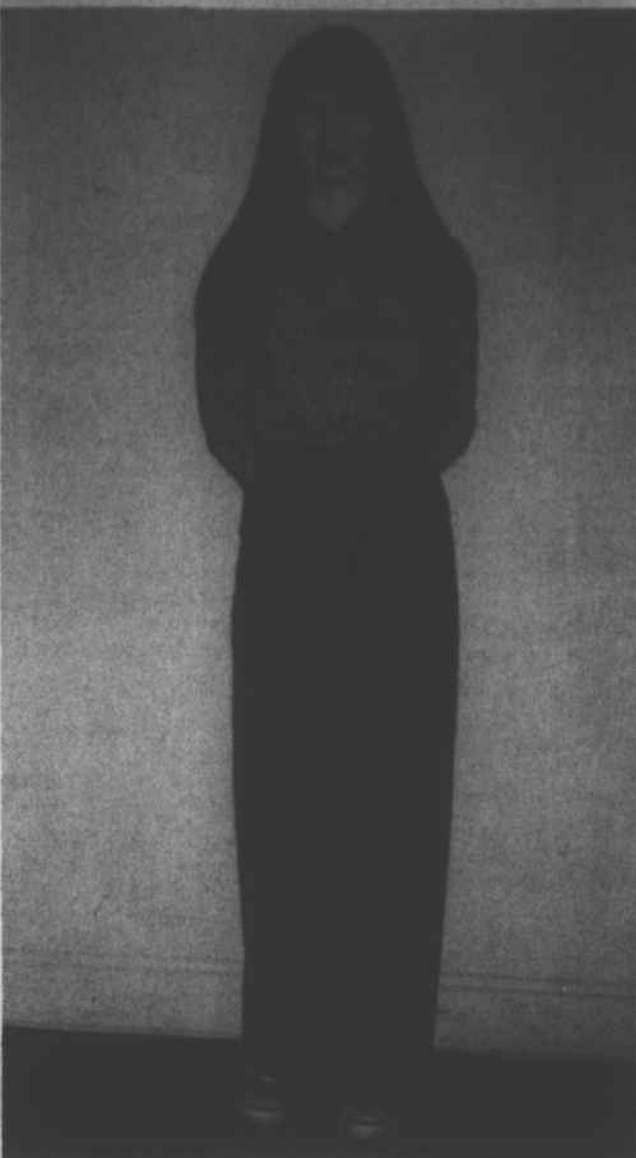

## LEGAL NOTICES

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING GARBAGE AND OTHER REFUSE BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Mars Hill: Section 1. Definitions. Garbage, as the term is used in this ordinance, shall be held to mean and include all refuse, animal, fruit and other vegetable matter, all tin cans, glassware and crockery in which any such matter has been put up or stored, all rags, waste paper, floor sweepings and other combustible refuse, except building material scraps and tree trimmings. Section 2. Garbage Required to be Properly Removed. No garbage that has become decayed or is otherwise a menace to health or cleanliness shall be allowed to remain in any dwelling house, commercial establishment or other building or on any premises a longer time than shall be reasonably necessary to remove and deposit the same in a can or cans as hereinafter provided in this ordinance. Section 3. Garbage Cans. The occupant of every building, premise or place where garbage does or may exist, shall provide himself with a garbage can made of a substantial and non-rusting material in which he shall deposit all garbage existing at the place occupied by him. Such can shall be provided with handles and with a tight-fitting cover made of the same material as the can. All garbage cans shall be water-tight. All cans shall be of a size that can conveniently be handled by the garbage collector, and unless a special permit has been obtained, shall not exceed a holding capacity of 35 gallons. All garbage cans shall be kept reasonably clean and sanitary. Section 4. Wet Garbage. All wet garbage shall have the liquid drained off and shall be wrapped in paper or other combustible material before it is placed in the garbage can thus preventing smell and the breeding of flies in summer and freezing and adhesion to the can in winter. Section 5. Deposit of Garbage in Public Places and on Private Property. No person shall throw, place or deposit any garbage in any street, alley, public place or private property within the city limits, except in garbage cans or garbage vehicles as provided in this ordinance. Section 6. Burning Prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to burn or set fire to garbage as defined in this ordinance for the purpose of disposal, and garbage shall be disposed of only as authorized by this ordinance. Section 7. Transportation of Garbage and Slops by Private Persons. No person or persons shall collect, handle, haul or transport, on any of the streets, alleys, public ways or places of the town, any garbage without first having procured a permit therefor from the Town of Mars Hill. Section 8. Removal of Garbage by Town. Garbage will be collected and removed from cans placed at the curb on the following days in the residential district: Monday and Thursday; and on the following days in the business district: Monday and Thursday. Section 9. Removal of Building Materials and Tree Trimmings. Scrap building materials and tree trimmings shall not be removed from any premises unless tied in bundles convenient for handling by a collector. Section 10. Hours for Placing Cans. Garbage cans or similar containers containing garbage, trash or ashes, for removal shall be placed at the curb from which the same are to be removed at or before 8:00 a.m. on the days set for removal. Section 11. Removal of Dead Animals. Dead animals will be removed upon request, but shall not be placed in containers with other garbage. Section 12. Penalty. (A) Garbage placed for removal in violation of the requirements of this ordinance shall not be picked up. When the Town Manager or person designated by Town Board determines that garbage has been properly placed, or prepared, he shall notify the person so placing it of the non-compliance, and shall order that the non-compliance be corrected. (B) Any person not complying with the requirements of this ordinance shall be subject to a civil penalty in the amount of \$100.00 payable to the Town of Mars Hill within 72 hours after receipt of a written citation. Section 13. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be full force and effect from and after the date of passage. Wilbur P. Powell Mayor Arthur Wood Town Clerk April 24; May 1, 1980ch.
