Small Business/FHA Offers Financing To Spur Development

An excellent current source of financing for small businesses is the Farmers Home Administration. In 1979, for example, Farmers Home guaranteed \$63,515,000 in North Carolina bank loans to businesses and individuals, twice as many business bank loans than the Small Business Administration guaranteed in the same period.

The real intent of the Farmers Home Administration business and industry loan program is to improve the quality of rural life and to

spur rural development. Loans can be made in any rural area outside the limits of a city of 50,000 population. In practice, priority goes to projects in open country, in rural communities, and in towns of 25,000 and smaller.

These Farmers Home bank guaranteed loans are available in any amount to companies of any size. The business borrower may take as long as 30 years to repay a loan for acquisition of land, buildings, or permanent fixtures and up to 15 years to repay loans for machinery and equipment. The FmHA allows several years to repay

loans for working capital. Such characteristics make FmHA loans more desirable than Small Business Administration loans or Economic Development Administration loans.

One of the principal advantages of the FmHA guaranteed loan program is that nearly every North Carolina county has a full-time loan officer to assist business owners in making applications.

The basic purpose of the FmHA loan guarantees are financing business and industry, increasing employment, and controlling pollution. Some possible uses of these loans include financing

business and industrial construction, plant conversion, plant acquisition, and modernization. These funds also can be used for purchasing and developing land and purchasing equipment, facilities, leases, machinery, supplies and materials. Working capital loans can be guaranteed under this program.

The first step in applying for a Farmers Home guaranteed loan is to arrange an interview with the nearest Farmers Home county agent. He will give you an indication of whether or not your request is possible under FmHA guidelines. If the indication is positive, your next step is to apply for the loan at your bank. Tell your banker that you plan to apply for a 90 percent guarantee from the FmHA.

When your banker gives you a tentative approval, your next step is to file the pre-application or formal application for the guarantee. There are a number of forms to fill out for this guarantee, so you might have your attorney and accountant assist in the preparation. In any case, your attorney and accountant may have experience in working with the FmHA.

Banjo Rally East Haywood Plans Music Events

East Haywood plans to capitalize on the Mountain Magic Festival weekend which should increase the number of folks coming into the area by sponsoring two musical events in mid-June.

Planned is a banjo rally competition scheduled in Canton June 20 and a Fiddlers Convention scheduled at the Clyde School in Clyde June 21.

According to Bill Parker, Haywood County Chamber of Commerce executive director, Mountain Magic weekend should generate some 30,000 people from outside the county.

The banjo contest site has not yet been designated but will be in downtown Canton. First prize is \$200 plus a trophy for old time and bluegrass music. Placements to third with cash and trophies.

A separate competition will be held for dance fiddlers. Free camping will be provided for all competitors. For further information call 456-3021 or write to Haywood County Chamber of Commerce, P.O. Box 125, Waynesville 28786.

Price is \$10 for any regular and all events. Price is \$5 at the gate.

The Fiddlers Convention, which promoters hope will become a legend, will offer cash prizes. In addition to money, original works of art exemplifying the spirit of our music will be awarded for all placements. The grand award is first in open class.

Classes are open, old time, bluegrass, heritage and novice. Open class offers \$750

for first; \$225 for second; and \$150 for third. Old time class offers \$75, \$35 and \$25. Bluegrass class offers \$75, \$35 and \$25. Heritage class offers \$75, \$35 and \$25. Novice class offers \$35, \$15 and \$15.

Contest judging rules and procedures apply. Quality judges are provided for all classes.

Thirty-five percent of registration money will be added to the placement except first in open.
