## Farmers Set Midwest Visit

Two busloads of western North Carolina dairy farmers, wives Extension agents and others will depart on Sunday,

July 13, for a five-day tour of dairy farms and university research units in Indiana, Wisconsin and Ohio.

The annual tour, sponsored by the dairy commission of the WNC Development Association and the N.C. Agricultural Extension Service is expected to include nearly 100 participants from 10 counties. The tour will start from the WNC Farmers Market in Asheville, with a pick-up in Haywood County.

After having lunch and a tour of the new \$40 million dollar Kentucky Horse Park at Lexington, Ky., the group will spend the night in Indianapolis, Ind.

This will be followed by a visit of the dairy facilities and herd at Purdue University at Lafayette, Ind., followed by a visit to the Hoard's Dairyman Farm, Hoard Historical Museum and an outstanding dairy farm at Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin.

While in Wisconsin, the group will also see the dairy herds and facilities at the University of Wisconsin at Madison, a dairy farm, cheese plant and American Breeders Service at De Forest, Wisconsin.

Other special functions included in the tour will be a dinner theatre performance in Indianapolis starring Caesar Romero and a Milwaukee Brewers - Baltimore Orioles baseball game in Milwaukee.

Tour leaders will be Grover Westmoreland, Henderson County Extension Chairman; J.D. Brooks, Extension agent,
