The bride was given in marriage by her father. She wore a formal gown of white organza with a white silk overlay applied with Venetian lace. The empire waist was accented by a full skirt and a lace trimmed chapel-length train. The fitted bodice was covered with lace accented by tiny seed pearls. The long sheer split bishop sleeves were edged in lace trimmed with pearls. The veil of silk illusion was edged in lace and fell from a matching lace cap lined with pearls. Vickie carried a bouquet of peach sweetheart roses, apricot carnations and babies' breath.

Joan Blankenship, sister of the bride, was matron of honor. She wore a sleeveless empire gown of peach silk.

The round neckline was accented by sheer layer ruffles. The back of the ruffled skirt was caught at the waist with a matching silk rose. Her fingertip veil of peach was attached to apricot daisies with peach silk streamers. She carried a bouquet of apricot rosebuds.
