Ramsey, Beall Elected



Speaker of the North Carolina House Liston B. Ramsey and his seatmate, Rep. Charles Beall of Canton were winners in Tuesdays election. Neither man was opposed for reelection to the 52nd House District.

Ramsey will be returning to the General Assembly for his eleventh term. He is expected to run for an unprecedented third term as house speaker when the legislature convenes in January.

Ramsey received 6,674 votes in incomplete returns. Beall polled 6,366, also in the early returns.
