July. There was no discussion regarding the dismissal of former acting police chief David Lankford during Monday's meeting, although the former chief was in the audience.

Town manager Larry Sprinkle, who dismissed Lankford, said he has interviewed four or five candidates for the department, but no decisions have been made as yet.

Several residents asked for increased police patrols at night.

The councilmen set a \$5 filing fee, the legal minimum, for candidates filing for office in the November municipal elections. Filing dates in Weaverville run from Sept. 13 until Oct. 4 for seats on the five-member council.

The council also approved a fran-chise agreement with te Carolina Power and Light Co. to provide electric power to the town. A previous agreement signed in 1915, expired earlier this year.

Mayor Sprinkle noted that his grandfather, William Sprinkle, signed the 1915 document as the town's mayor. The present mayor's father, C.N. Sprinkle, also signed the agreement as a member of the town council.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m. Next regularly scheduled meeting is set for Sept. 16 at 7 p.m.
