hills of Madison County, measuring the temperature of its springs and looking for other signs of escaping hot air from beneath the surface. By means of infrared photography, Stupka hopes to be able to show evidence of thermal activity.

"Anyone knowing of any hot springs, or hot steam blow holes or vents, or even deep caves, we'd like to hear from them," Smathers said. "We want to compile enough conclusive evidence by April 16, to convince the DOE that Western North Carolina is unsuitable for their purpose."

Dr. Garrett Smathers has asked that anyone who has any information concerning geological, hydrological, ecological or other scientific characteristics that could disqualify WNC from DOE's list of repository candidates to call him at Canton Town Hall, 648-2363.
