Kindermusik Begins Third Year

The Kindermusik program at Mars Hill College begins its third year with the opening of schools next week. Instructor Lora Scott will conduct an open house on Aug. 19 for the parents of children interested in music.

The Kindermusik program is open to four and five-year old children and serves as an introduction to music.

At the Tuesday evening open house, Scott will outline the activities and goals of the two-year program. "Preschool children are just the right age to learn about music. I was very excited to discover Kindermusik because it fills a real need for structured music education for the very young," Mrs. Scott says.

The program attempts to make music-making fun. The children sing, dance, act out stories, play a variety of instruments, create their own music and are introduced to a wide variety of music from rock to Bach. The two-year program involves

parents, but Scott says that parent need no prior musical training to encourage their children. Classes will meet one hour each week throughout the school year. Each child in the program is equipped with a glockenspiel, a small bar instrument; a primer and workbook.

Mrs. Scott has offered private musical training in Madison County since 1975 and introduced the Kindermusik program here two years ago. She is an instructor in voice, piano and music fundamentals at Warren Wilson College in Swannanoa. She recently received her master's degree in music from Western Carolina University.

The open house will be conducted in Moore Auditorium beginning at 7:30 p.m. in Room 144. Classes are scheduled to begin on Aug. 25. For more information on the Kindermusik program, call 649-2320.
