Unemployment Rises

Unemployment increased slightly during September according to figures released last week by the North Carolina Employment Security Commission (ESC.) The monthly report on statewide joblessness states that unemployment increased by two-tenths of a percentage point during the month, to 5.4 percent.

Madison County unemployment

stood at 7.4 percent in August. September's county unemployment report will be released later this week.

Nationally, unemployment stood at seven percent in Sept., up slightly from August's 6.8 reading. Massachusetts with 4.2 percent and New Jersey with 4.7 percent report the lowest joblessness among the 11 largest states.

He decreed that the judge's body be skinned and tanned and used to cover the seat where the judges sat in judgement, a grim reminder to them that they should never allow prejudice to affect their verdicts.</p> <p>We shudder at such a method but it does bring into clear focus the awesome responsibility some among us have as they strive to render justice to all.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Jesus was clear and plain about judging. Said He: "Judge not that you be not judged. For with the judgement you pronounce you will be judged, and the measure you give will be the measure you get." (Matt. 7:12)</p> <p style="text-align: right;">He was not speaking of our court system so much as the system of relationships with one another.
