## Guy To Speak At Revival

Dr. Cal Guy will be the featured speaker at the First Baptist Church of Marshall during the week of April 5-12, 1987. Many area residents may recall Guy from a previous visit to Marshall.

A native of Jackson, Tenn., Guy is known as a forceful speaker with impressive credentials and extensive travel experience. His writings have appeared in numbers of Baptist literary publications.

Until his retirement in 1982, Guy served as professor of missions, with the title of distinguished professor, at the Southwestern Baptist Theological

Center. He has served as pastor in churches in Tennessee and Texas, and was in the past pastor of International Baptist Church in Jurbee, Belgium, from 1966 to 1977, and of Emmanuel Baptist Church in Paris, France, in 1983-84.

In 1960, he was founding director of World Mission Church Growth

Center. Special music will be presented during the services, which will begin at 7 p.m. each evening.
