

Mars Hill Man Joins Dealer Group

Larry L. Burda of Phi-Co Hardware and Building Supply in Mars Hill has been chosen as a member of a select dealer group which will help chart the future growth and progress of Ace Hardware Corporation.

Called the Ace Team Dealer Advisory Group, this and 12 other such regional groups will represent dealers served by their particular Ace distribution center. Burda will represent dealers served by Ace's Atlanta Distribution Center.

Firewood Available In Haywood County

The U.S. Forest Service has announced the opening of a free-use firewood area in Haywood County, in an effort to provide area residents with firewood for home heating.

The area is located off of Buzzard Roost Road at the intersection of the old Sterling Creek Road in the "12-mile strip" area south of Interstate 40.

Any wood within the marked and posted boundary may be removed as firewood. Use of vehicles within the boundary will be prohibited during wet weather conditions. The area will be through Oct. 30.

Signs will be posted to help in

locating the area. A free-use permit is required for this area and must be in your possession when cutting.

To obtain a permit, call or come by the U.S. Forest Service office in Hot Springs.

Any firewood gathered on free-use permits is for personal use only and cannot be sold or traded. Failure to comply with the terms of the permit is a violation of federal regulations and could result in a fine of up to \$500 or six months in jail, or both.

USDA Distribution Set Next Week

U.S. Department of Agriculture commodities will be distributed next Wednesday and Thursday at the main office of the Department of Social Services.

People with last names beginning with the letters M-Z will be able to pick up cheese and butter on Wednesday between the hours of 1 and 4 p.m.

Those with last names beginning with A-L will be able to pick up commodities on Thursday, Aug. 27, between 1 and 4 p.m.

Food stamp recipients will receive

an authorization card from Raleigh as with previous distributions. Receipts must bring this card with them to receive commodities.

Some income-eligible households were pre-certified in October 1986. Those households will need to bring their blue card in order to receive commodities.

Households that neither receive food stamps or are pre-certified will be able to make application the date of distribution that corresponds to their last name.

NOTICE OF HEARING**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has instituted a rulemaking proceeding to consider allowing the shared use and/or resale of telephone services.

"Shared use" refers to an arrangement whereby several users on the same premises collectively use the phone services and facilities obtained from an underlying carrier, and each user pays a share proportionate to the nature of his subscription and use. "Resale" means an arrangement whereby someone buys the phone services and facilities of a carrier and then sells those services to someone else.

SHARED USE AND RESALE OF TELEPHONE SERVICES

On June 22, 1987, the North Carolina Assembly ratified a bill (Chapter 445, SB 822) amending N.C.G.S. 62-110 to authorize the Commission to allow shared use and/or resale of telephone services. Due to the far-reaching issues that this legislation has raised, the Commission has concluded that it should hold a general investigation to consider, consistent with the public interest, the adoption of rules necessary to allow the shared use and resale of telephone service.

The major issues which the Commission will consider in its investigation are as follows:

First, the Commission will determine to what extent telephone service may be shared and/or resold and to what extent terms, conditions, and rates charged by subscribers who share and/or resell telephone service may become subject to additional regulations on the services which they provide.

Certain existing subscribers may also be affected by the second major issue which the Commission will consider in this investigation — determination of the appropriate measured or message rates for application by the local exchange companies for the services which they provide to subscribers who share and/or resell service. Hotels, motels, time share, or condominium complexes which are operated primarily to serve transient occupants which provide telephone service to those occupants and make charges for that service will become subject to measured rates where facilities are available or message rates otherwise for telephone service provided to them by the local exchange companies.

Other establishments which share and/or resell telephone service will also become subject to measured or message rates which will be established in this proceeding. In addition, the Commission will consider whether or not these measured or message rates should apply to hospitals, nursing homes, rest homes, licensed retirement centers, clubs, and educational institutions which provide service to their patrons, members, or students living in quarters furnished by the school.

Other issues which the Commission will consider include implementation of quality of service requirements for shared and/or resold services and the determination of what terms and conditions would apply to service provided by a local exchange company directly to persons within its service area where shared or resold service is available on the premises.

HEARING

The hearing on this matter has been scheduled to begin on Tuesday, October 20, 1987, at 9:30 a.m. in the Commission Hearing Room 2115, Debs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina, and to continue, as necessary, to conclusion.

Persons desiring to intervene in the matter as formal parties of record should file a motion under North Carolina Utilities Commission Rules R1-6, R1-7, and R1-19. Persons desiring to file testimony as formal parties of record should do so on or before Tuesday, October 6, 1987. Other persons desiring to present testimony for the record should appear at the hearing. Persons desiring to send written statements to the Commission should submit their statements prior to the hearing and should include any information which those persons wish to be considered in the investigation of this matter. The contents of letters and petitions will be received in the official file as statements of position. Specific facts, however, will only be considered on the basis of testimony presented at the hearing.
