

One day Jesus was confronted with 5,000 hungry people who had been listening to his teaching. In an effort to satisfy their physical needs, he asked his disciples to find some food for them.

All they could find was five loaves and two small fish carried by a little boy in his lunch bag. But Jesus took the shared-lunch and multiplied it until all were filled, brimful and running over, and they had left-overs.
