Farmers with highly erodible he said. cropland have just two years to meet the conservation requirements of the 1985 Farm Bill and remain eligible for U.S. Department of Agriculture

Russell Blevins, Madison County district conservationist with the USDA Soil Conservation Service, said those provisions require farmers who have highly erodible land to have a conservation plan approved by their local conservation district by Dec. 31, 1989, and have it implemented by Dec. 31, 1994, to remain eligible for USDA farm program benefits, loans or guarantees on all their land.

About 1,500 conservation plans need to be developed in Madison County in the next two years, Blevins said. "The sooner farmers ask for a plan, the greater the chance that we will get to everyone by the deadline,"

Only about 10 percent of the highly erodible cropland was placed under a conservation plan as of Oct. 1, 1987, he said. "Our goal is to have 65 percent of this land under a conservation plan by the end of 1988 and the rest by the end of 1989," Blevins said.

Because highly erodible land is not always obvious to the eye, farmers should check with their local SCS office to see if they have land that meets the criteria.

Another option is to enroll in the highly erodible cropland in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP). Under the program, landowners


