Project Herbs is aimed at initiating and developing small business based on new agricultural commodities and linking local people with new economic opportunities.

This spring, eight Madison County Farmers planted demonstration plots to illustrate the techniques and procedures involved in growing, harvesting and marketing herbs. Most of this year's crop will be sold in local markets already identified by the organization. This demonstration phase of the two-year pilot project will be the basis of an expanded participation next year.

The funds will be used to support research and extension programs designated by the North Carolina Tobacco Foundation and the North Carolina Tobacco Foundation

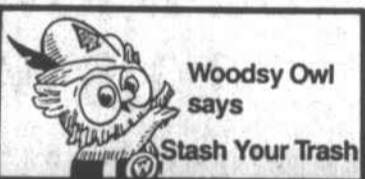
Research Fund. In addition to the Foundation projects, \$160,000 has been designated for research directed toward understanding and overcoming the blue mold disease problem.

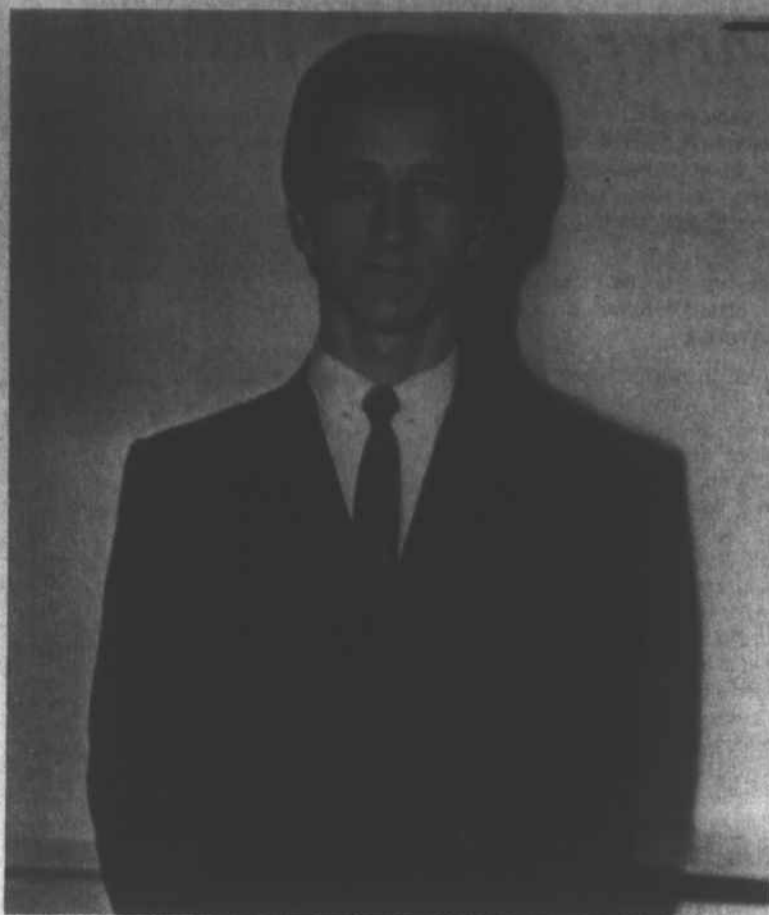

The Southern Appalachian Repertory Theater (SART) continues the fourteenth season of professional theater with the comic drama Painting Churches by Tina Howe.

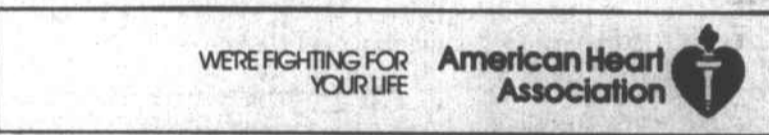
Painting Churches will run July 14-17. Evening performances are at 8:15 p.m. and Sunday matinees are at
