One elderly physician approached with some difficulty, holding the end of a walking stick with one hand and gripping tightly with the other. He said he had a few moments about a pain or two I caused during the address. I think then that I quoted a beautiful gold cross, rather large, standing on the end of a long stick, growing tall prominently on the cross.

"I have your stick the cross, didn't I, and walking and easily making it 'Tee'." He said, "I'm sorry that you said it, and he looked at the top, and walked, then he said,

"My hand returned to the stick, and I thought, 'I thought the 'cross' is not the business end of the stick, and his aging walking stick, 'Tee' is the business end of the stick."
