In 1915 the cotten crop in Har-nett county was 15,656 bales, accord-ing to a statement by G. W. Mana, of the University Summer school. In number of bales Harnett ranks sevensath in all the cotton producing counties of the State. Robeson led in 1915, producing 45,535 bales, or 11,507 more bales than Johnston, the second largest cotton-producing coun ty. The State total 1915 crop was 600,604 bales.
