In 1915 the cotton crop in Harnett county was 15,656 bales, according to a statement by G. W. Mass, of the University Summer school. In number of bales Harnett ranks seventeenth in all the cotton producing counties of the State. Robeson led in 1915, producing 45,535 bales, or 11,897 more bales than Johnston, the second largest cotton-producing county. The State total 1915 crop was 699,494 bales. From fifteen to twenty-two thousand bales are sold each year on the Dunn market, cotton coming to this market from Johnston, Sampson, and Cumberland counties.

Harnett now has a Supervisor of Rural Schools. Miss Cherry, who has been assigned this work, has arrived in the county and taken up her duties. She is practical and thoroughly qualified to do this work and the people may expect a great deal of good from this new departure in the educational life of the county. Other progressive counties in the State adopted this plan and wherever it has been tried it has proved to be satisfactory. Prof. Gentry has made splendid progress in his work since becoming superintendent of the county schools, and now that he has an assistant the educational life of Harnett will move forward at an even greater pace.

**ATTENTION GRADED SCHOOL PATRONS**

Attention of patrons of the Dunn Graded School is called to the following regulations:

1. By a special act of the School Board, pupils who enter the first grade and who have never been to school must do so within the first two weeks of the school term or wait for entrance until next session. First grade pupils who become six years old before February 1st of current session may enter at the beginning of the school term.
2. All pupils must have on file in the office of the Superintendent a certificate of successful vaccination within five years or a certificate showing they have been vaccinated within ten days of the opening of school. These certificates must be filed before September 15th; otherwise pupils will not be admitted.
3. Tuition fees will be charged non-resident pupils as follows:
