COMMITTEE WILL MEET TUESDAY, JANUARY 22.

Mr. Godwin, Chairman for Harnett County, has arranged an interesting program.

Owing to the extremely bad condition of the weather on last Friday, the 4th, the meeting of the Executive Committee for the County of the National War Savings Committee was postponed to be held at Lillington, N. C., on Tuesday, Jan. 22, 11 o'clock A. M. At that meeting I hope to have forty or fifty people from each township in the County. At this meeting we have prominent speakers who will make addresses. Among the speakers, will be: Col. F. H. Fries, State Director; Hon. R. D. W. Connor and W. B. Drake of Raleigh. The campaign in this county will be launched in earnest on that day, for the raising during the present year of \$457,825.00 which is Harnett County's share in this campaign. The Government is seeking to raise during the current year a war saving fund of two billion dollars (\$2,000,000,000) and North Carolina's share is \$50,000,000 in round numbers.

The first and second Liberty Loans in denominations as low as \$50.00 did not reach the small investor. There are millions and millions of Americans to whom \$50.00 is a large sum to get together in a brief period and the \$50.00 Liberty Bond was beyond the reach of the majority of the people. The Government now comes to the small investor with a proposition which every man, woman and child in the United States may accept with profit. Thrift Stamps make it possible for every purchaser of 25 cents to become a creditor of the United States and to contribute directly to the successful prosecution of the war.

The purchaser of a Thrift Stamp for 25 cents receives a card to which he attaches it. The card has space for sixteen Thrift Stamps which may be attached one by one as fast as the purchaser can afford to buy them. When the card is full it is exchanged by payment of 18 cents additional for a War Savings Stamp, pasted upon a War Savings Certificate. This certificate has space for twenty War Savings Stamps. For every War Savings Stamp spent during Government will pay on Jan. 1, 1922 \$5.00. In other words for every \$4.12 you lend the Government now the Government will re-pay \$5.00 in five years. You get back the principal with 4 per cent interest compounded quarterly.

The method is very simple and it teaches the great lesson of saving and service.

Not all of us can go to the front but we are sending our young men to the front and it is our duty to see that they are better equipped than any other soldier in the war. The Government is anxious to do this but it believes every one, old or young to do his part. Practically nothing has been done so far towards raising Harnett's pro rate part of this fund. The campaign is on at white heat in other counties and at the end of the year we do not want this county to fall under its share.
