

False Statements Denied.

To our Customers and Public:

Our attention has been called to some erroneous statements regarding (Sofosco) or Florida Soft Phosphate as sold by the Seminole Phosphate Company of Croom, Fla.

We understand that Mr. Rawlins who was formerly with our Company but now with the Acme Phosphate Company has made the following statements regarding Sofosco. To-wit: That the Seminole Phosphate Company, who have been doing quite a good business in this section for the past two years, are now mixing their Soft Phosphate with rock so as to increase percentage and make a cheaper product. This is a plain falsehood. We have never put out anything but high grade soft phosphate, with a guaranteed analysis of not less than 26 per cent. We have been in this business for over 15 years and we are still putting out the same guaranteed product. Mr. Rawlins further states that the Seminole people do not own their property and have been enjoined from doing business and will not be able to deliver goods. This is another false statement, as we have recently put in more than (\$30,000) thirty thousand dollars in new machinery in order to increase our output.

Soft Phosphate is found in pockets or veins and cannot be selected off by hand consequently making the cost higher.

We know nothing of the Acme Phosphate Co. Their product is new, this being the first season on the market but we understand they are mining their product by steam shovels if so they can not put out a high grade soft phosphate, because they will get sand and gravel in same.

We do not or will not knock our competitors and we have no patience with a competitor who willfully and knowingly allows its representative to go out and make erroneous statements and sell their goods on the reputation of another company's product. The representative of the Acme Phosphate Company is claiming that his goods are the same as Seminole, which is untrue as the Seminole Company puts out a higher grade of goods. Soft Phosphate as sold by the Seminole Co. is no experiment, while the so-called Soft Phosphate sold by the Acme Phosphate Company has never been tried.

We wish to warn the public that the above claims made by the Acme representative is untrue and that our product is in a higher class in analysis and has proved to be one of the best sources of phosphoric acid on the market.

LESS SUGAR IS GOOD FOR HEALTH.

The American people have entirely too big a "sugar tooth," according to the State Board of Health, and the enforced conservation measures of the Food Administration are proving highly beneficial to the public health. Sugar is not an essential as an article of food, carbohydrates in the form of starch being more wholesome. To offset the reduction in the amount of sugar consumed it is suggested that people should chew more. By long chewing the saliva has an opportunity to act upon the starch, converting it into sugar. Never use sugar with cereals. All the starch of the cereal is converted into sugar in the body hence adding sugar is like carrying coals to Newcastle. Malt sugar is more wholesome than cane sugar, and may be used in place of it as a dressing by drying.

The following ten rules are offered for the saving of sugar:
Do not leave sugar in the bottom of the tea, coffee or cocoa cup.
Sweeten breakfast cereals with honey, syrup, maple sugar, raisins or dates.
Substitute molasses or corn syrup for part of sugar used in cooking.
Make cakes without frosting.

Use fresh, dried or preserved fruit for dessert in the place of "made dishes" that require sugar.
Cut down the use of candies and sweet drinks.
Preserve as much fruit as possible by drying.
Can fruits without the use of sugar. This may be successfully done by the cold pack method.
Limit the amount of jelly or preserves used. These should be mainly for children and invalids.
Use no more than three or four tablespoonsful of sugar each day, for each person, including that used in cooking and that used on the table.
