WHAT IS BOLSHEVISM?

Bolshevism? Through first...
Bolshevism is a disease itself or only the symptom of a diseased society. Its existence is an indisputable fact. Travelling under numerous aliases, its identity is the same wherever its ugly head has raised itself. To define it in terms is difficult. The vocabulary of civilization is too limited to express the full meaning of such abandoned depravity as that which speaks in the Red Terror. Being, first and last, a force of universal annihilation, it baffles classification. It cannot be counted a political movement, for it seeks to play no part as a political factor in national life. It recognizes no sovereignty save its own, seeks no goal except the gratification of its own brutish lust and unbridled desires. Nor can it be considered a social movement, for socialism at least presupposes the greatest good to the greatest number. Bolshevism, on the other hand, knows no such limitation. Instead of merging the individual in a society body, it would exalt the individual to the enslavement of his fellow-man. No more can it be held to be an economic movement, for economy, both public and private, rests upon conceptions of law and property rights which Bolshevism denies. It is the antithesis of all things that go into the progress of humanity towards the fulfillment of its destiny and the incarnation of all those sinister forces that would drag a man down to the level of a beast. It has survived the conflict as a continuing menace to the happiness of the world. Conceived in sin and brought forth in iniquity, it stands forth as a monster challenging the future and mocking the present. Only treachery and lust could have gotten such an offspring in Russia and this same pair are its parents wherever it may be found.

Bolshevism has flourished in the former Empire of the Romanoffs because that unhappy country was ready prey. The frailty of its victims is its chief strength. Embodying those vicious traits that centuries of civilization have suppressed but have not been able wholly to eradicate, it breaks through the surface at weakest points. It appeals to man's evil nature. It harks back through the ages and renews the sleeping fires of passion into consuming flames. It enlists under its red banner all those who have committed crime in their hearts and looses them upon the world to work its undoing in the name of Bolshevism. To this standard of revolt against the established order of things, those who know no restraint to evil desire save that imposed by law flock like homing vultures. The criminally disposed see in the Red Terror an opportunity to make war against mankind. Thus has this menace, in the United States as on the other side of the Atlantic, called to its colors only the vilest elements of the population.

Bolshevism is a monster. Signifying rule by the majority, it crushes the majority beneath its dread away. It seeks to exercise a tyranny more oppressive than that of absolute despotism. Even if it truly represented the majority, as it claims to do, it would fall as short of true democracy as did autocracy. Recognition of the rights of the minority is as essential to a democratic form of government as is the exercise of rights by the greater number. Power over the governed necessarily carries with it duties and obligations that can not be disregarded. Such a conception is as foreign to the Bolsheviki as it was to the Hohenzollern when he was master of Germany. Liberty, which is and always must be the passport of democracy in the language of Bolshevism, means license—license to slay and rob and ravish, license to burn and ravage, license to oppress and tyrannize.

Bolshevism is to humanity what Vesuvius in eruption is to nature—a violent upheaval of pent up and annihilating forces. It constructs nothing; it destroys everything. If it could lay the world in ruins, it would pull down the structure of civilization and use the wrecked mass for its habitation. After us the deluge" is the slogan of the Red Peril.
