I would have been all right along my own line of reasoning had I not listened to the honest appeal of honest friends to share with them in dishonest company. At that time apparently looking all right to us all, I took these shares in good faith without even going to Texas to the oil fields or to the Idaho gold fields to investigate. There are hosts of swindlers ready to use the other fellow's money if they can but persuade him that they can make better returns on it than he can himself. There is a lure about oil that causes many to ruin so it is best to steer clear of all such stock. It is true some of it must be good and it will be good, but "who knows" what tree the lightning will strike? These vultures manage to operate so as to take no risks whatever of being caught. A robber is more honorable as he takes risks. This was 20 years ago and they are harvesting "suckers" yet. **AS THE STARS HAVE IT**

20. Because he is best equipped in all respects of any man in the race.

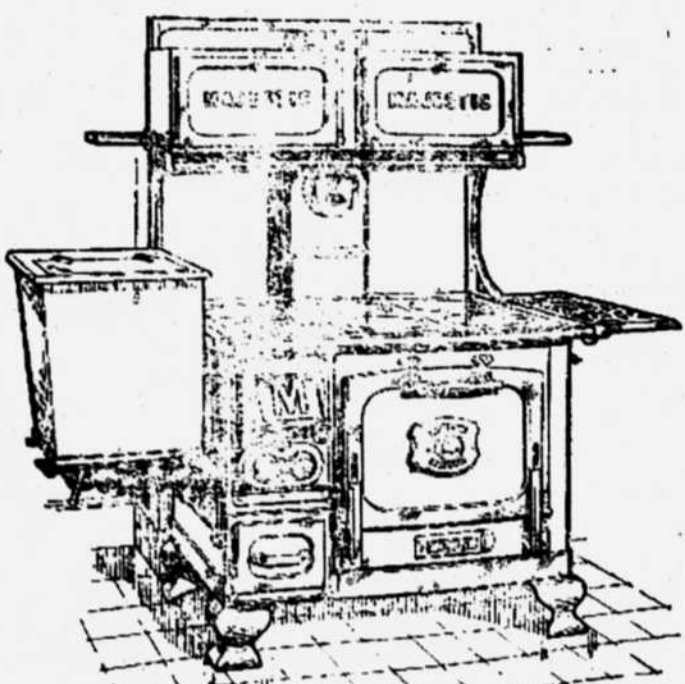
