Department of Justice Agents Take Charge 600 Barrels in Duplin County Warehouse

LIBEL OF INFORMATION SWORN OUT YESTERDAY

The largest seizure of sugar in the South since the Lever Act became operative, occurred yesterday at Rose Hill, in Duplin county, when Department of Justice agents took charge of 600 barrels of graunlated sugar consigned to J. 
