

EMMON DE VALERA'S OWN COUNTY VOTES IN FAVOR OF ANGLo-IRISH TREATY

Ennis, Ireland, Dec. 22.—The Clare County Council, the constituency of Emon de Valera, today voted, 17 to 5, in favor of the treaty between Ireland and Great Britain and requested Mr. De Valera to use his influence for the maintenance of national unity.

The resolution admitted that there were grave objections to the treaty, but declared that there was no real alternative to its acceptance.

"Rejection of the treaty," the resolution added "would be almost certain to involve us in a war of annihilation because our people will be divided and because world opinion, instead of being with us, as at present, will be against us."

Copies of the resolution were sent to Mr. De Valera and other Clare representatives.
