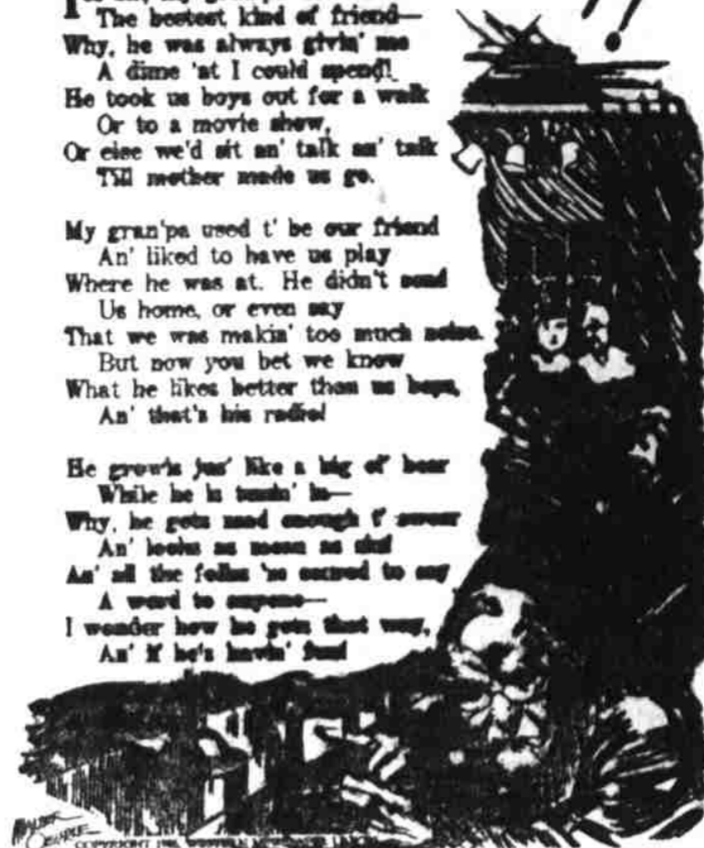
He's not the same today!

JUNIOR RED CROSS AIDS PEACE BY BIG GROWTH

Gains 142,000 Members in Year in Schools Throughout United States.

A new high level in peace time membership of the American Junior Red Cross is reported for 1925—the month numbering 1,326,648 school girls and boys—a gain of 142,000.

This unique and powerful children's organization started as a war measure, but today is one of the greatest influences for peace ever known. An increasing participation in local programs of service has featured their year's growth. It is indicated that to a greater degree than ever pupils in the schools are performing individual and collective acts of service in a true Red Cross spirit.

The success of the Junior Red Cross program, launched last year through co-operation of the 4400-Serving Service of the Red Cross, has led to a determination to make it a regular feature of both these branches.

An outstanding feature of the Junior Red Cross work this year was the participation for the first time of a Junior Red Cross member in the disaster relief operations following the tremors in Missouri, Illinois, and Indiana. Schools in many new territories localities displayed a keen interest in sending tags and books for the use of the children in the disaster area.

The Junior Red Cross program has flourished not alone in settled communities, but has been extended to Indian schools, and to native Alaskan schools where many Eskimo children undertake Junior work. In addition, the international correspondence between schools in peering more and more popular American schools are now corresponding with those in thirty-four countries.

Strong Membership Appeal in Red Cross Disaster Relief

Asking themselves "What if disaster should visit our city?" the leading citizens of many communities of the United States have adopted the Scout motto to "Be Prepared."

Impressed by the frequency and the wide range of peace time calamities in their country, they have organized their communities with the thoroughness which normal conditions permit, against the possibility of a time when there will be no chance for thought or plan. Red Cross Chapters in many localities are similarly prepared.

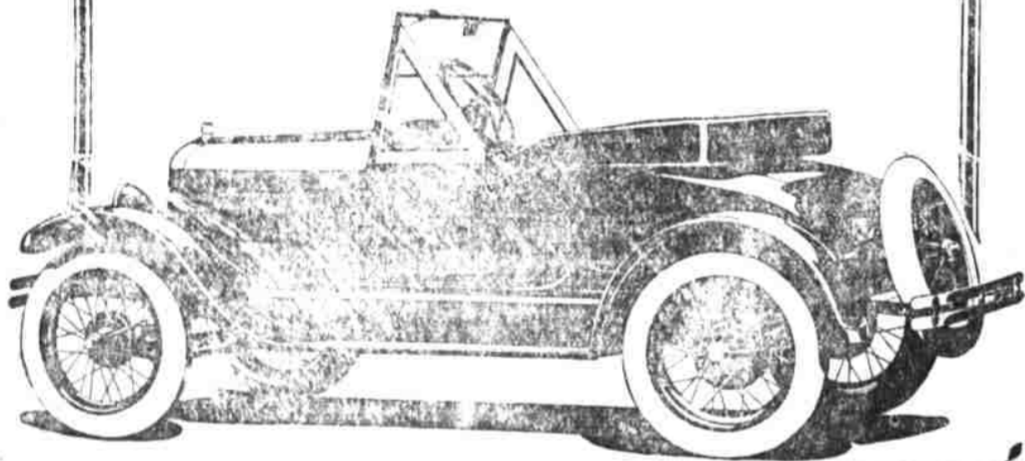

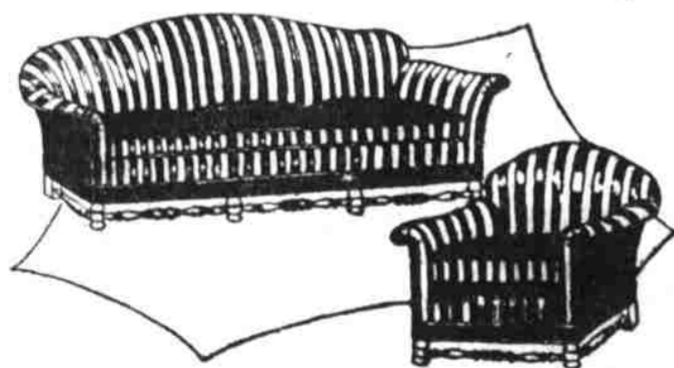

FURTHERING WORLD PEACE

Public opinion in America is rallying to the belief that the nation's own prosperity depends to a great extent on the prosperity of others. By helping the Near East Relief you are laying a great foundation for America's future in foreign lands.

You may think it strange that I, as an Englishman, should rejoice to see American competition growing in these countries of the Near East. I do so not only because as a sincere friend and admirer I am glad to see prosperity in this country, but also because I believe it will bring prosperity to these countries also.

At the time of the Christian emodus from Russia, 1,500,000 refugees were crowded into impoverished Greece. It is estimated that fifty per cent of these people are now able to provide for themselves. The Greek government is spending millions for this purpose, and the refugee commission of the League of Nations is administering a large international loan for the same purpose. I say this to show how little it is to expect these overwhelmed agencies to take over the two thousand children whom the Near East Relief is so generously and efficiently supporting, teaching them to earn their own living and become useful citizens. For the Near East Relief not only gives these children what we generally mean by education, but also, has them all kinds



of trades by which they may become self-supporting as they grow up.

Here is a work in which we all, whatever our faith, can gladly and heartily co-operate. It is a common ground on which we can all join in the service of God and of our fellow men.

Golden Rule Sunday will be observed throughout the United States in December, on behalf of the Near East Relief.
