Section I. That the Town of Waynesville, pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly of North Carolina, ratified December 14, 1921, entitled

Section II. That said street and portions of streets are nereby declared sanitary districts, and all persons resanitary districts, and all persons re-siding or owning property fronting on sain affects are hereby required and directed to use cit, water and connect with the city newer as soon as the sewer lines shall have been laid in said streets, and it shall be unlaw-ful for any person living in any house, or for the owner of any house to parent our torent to live in any to permit any tenant to live in any house along said streets or to contin-ue to occupy said property for a period of thirty days after the laying of a sewer line along said street without building and constructing toilets connected with said sewer line.


