A committee was appointed to submit for adoption next Monday evening a constitution and by-laws and secure a charter from the State by April 1st when it is hoped the association will begin to function. Quite a number have already taken shares and other will subscribe during the next three weeks after which more can take shares during the next six months. This organization is already very strong and safe and will grow stronger from time to time. It means more for the building of Clyde and vicinity than anything we have hitherto had. . Rev. J. M. Haynes, 77, occupied the Baptist pulpit last Sunday at both the morning and evening service. His text Sunday morning was taken from Hebrews 13:6 . "The Lord is my helper." Prof. R. A.
