

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FOR A TAX FOR A BOND ISSUE FOR A PUBLIC HOSPITAL AND FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE SAME IN HAYWOOD COUNTY.

Notice is hereby given that more than five hundred and seventy-three (573) residents and free holders of Haywood County, more than one hundred and fifty (150) of whom reside outside of the corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville, have duly filed before the Board of Commissioners for the County of Haywood a petition, therein petitioning the Board of Commissioners for the County of Haywood to levy an annual tax not to exceed one-fiftieth of one per cent on the dollar to be levied for a period of time not exceeding thirty years, for the purpose of providing funds for the purchase of a site and the erection thereon of a public hospital and a hospital building in the eastern section of the Town of Waynesville, in Haywood County, North Carolina.

And further notice is hereby given that on this date the Board of Commissioners for the County of Haywood have ordered a special election to be called and held in the several voting precincts of Haywood County on the 5th day of June, 1926, for the purpose of voting one-fiftieth of one cent on the dollar tax for a bond issue for a public hospital and for the maintenance thereof, in the eastern section of the Town of Waynesville, such bond issue not to exceed \$100,000, and said tax to be levied for a period of time not to exceed thirty years.

And notice is further hereby given that a new registration of the voters of Haywood County has been ordered by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Haywood for the purpose of said special election, as provided by law, and to that end and for the purposes aforesaid the registration books for the several voting precincts of Haywood County will be open from and after the 1st day of May, 1926, as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE \$45,000 STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Hazelwood:

Section 1. That for the purpose of constructing or reconstructing the surface of roads, streets or highways within the Town of Hazelwood, including the contemporaneous construction or reconstruction of sidewalks, curbs, gutters and drains, and including grading, the Town of Hazelwood shall issue not exceeding \$45,000 Street Improvement Bonds pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That the statement of the debt of the Town has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Section 4. That said improvements shall be made pursuant to an act ratified December 19, 1921, entitled "An Act relating to local improvements in the Town of Hazelwood," and that one-half of the cost thereof, including intersections, shall be specially assessed, as provided in said act.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, and shall not be submitted to the voters.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 2nd day of March, 1926, and was first published on the 4th day of March, 1926. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within 30 days after its first publication.

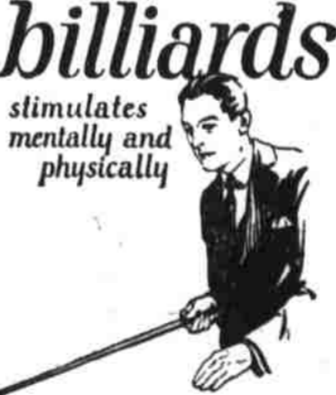

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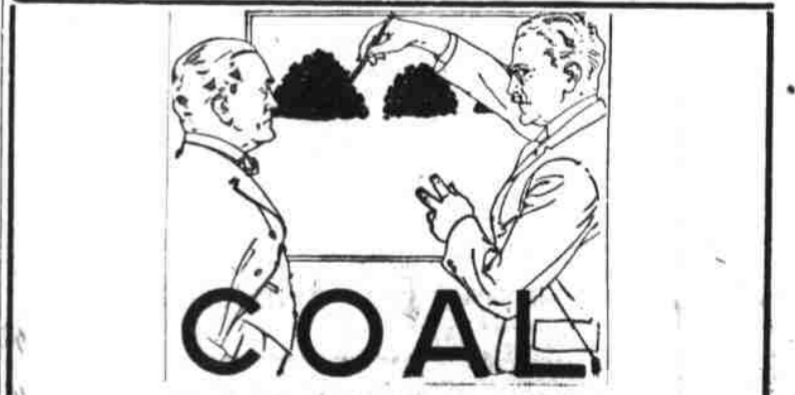
