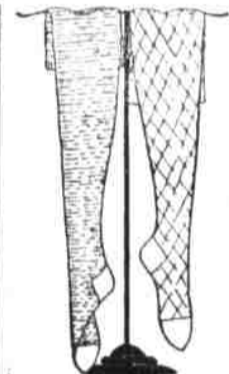

### RESOLUTION AND NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville:

Section 1. That the Town of Waynesville, pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly of North Carolina, ratified December 14, 1921, entitled "An Act Relating to Local Improvements in the Town of Waynesville," and other laws authorizing the same shall grade, improve and pave with concrete, asphalt, or other hard-surface material, Smathers Street and extensions from Commerce Street in a southerly direction through the Sulphur Springs grounds to the corporate limits at a point near the Sulphur Springs Hotel Annex and Love Avenue from Love Lane to corporate limits and to construct curbs, gutters, drains and sidewalks in and along said streets.

Section 2. That two-thirds of the total cost of said streets and sidewalk improvements shall be especially assessed upon the lots and parcels of land abutting directly on the improvements according to the extent of their respective frontages thereon by an equal rate per foot of such frontage and that the remainder of such cost shall be borne by the municipality at large.

Section 3. That said assessments against the abutting property owners shall be payable in ten equal annual installments, which shall bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum from the date of the confirmation of the assessment roll; provided that said property owner shall have the option of paying said assessment in cash, and if the whole assessment shall have been paid within thirty days after the assessment roll shall have been placed within the hands of the tax collector, a 2% discount shall be allowed.

That the owners of all property abutting on said street to be improved, as aforesaid, shall connect their several premises with the water mains and sewer pipes where located in said street adjacent to their several premises, by making the proper and necessary taps and connections with the water and sewer lines within twenty days; and, if the property owners shall fail to make said connections within said date, the said Town of Waynesville will cause said connections and taps to be made, and the cost thereof will be charged against said abutting property.

The foregoing resolution was unanimously adopted at a meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville, held this the 8th day of April, 1936.
