SPECIAL SCHOOL TAXING DISTRICT,  
HAYWOOD COUNTY,  
NORTH CAROLINA.**

TAKE NOTICE that a special elec-  
tion has been called by the Board of  
Commissioners of Haywood County,  
North Carolina, to be held on Tuesday,  
the 25th day of May, 1926, in Fines  
Creek Special School Taxing District,  
which said School Taxing District is  
described as follows:

All that certain territory known as  
Fines Creek Township in Haywood  
County, and also that territory known  
as Teague's School District in White  
Oak Township, said Teague's School  
District being described as follows:  
Begin at the mouth of Catalochee  
Creek and runs with line between  
White Oak Township and Catalochee  
Township to the McDaniel place;  
thence down the dividing ridge to High  
Knob; thence to the Chestnut Flat; thence  
thence down the dividing ridge be-  
tween Wm. Messer place and the  
Lawson D. Messer place to the river;  
thence down the river to the BEGIN-  
NING.

The purpose of said election is to  
ascertain the will of the qualified  
voters whether there shall be levied  
in said District a local annual tax, not  
exceeding Twenty Cents on the one  
hundred dollars valuation of all prop-  
erty, real and personal, to supplement  
the funds for the six months' public  
school term and to equalize school  
advantages within the said Special  
School Taxing District.

Said election will be held at Hiram  
Rogers School House in said District,  
which is hereby designated as the  
place for holding said election; and  
Charlie McCracken and Hubert Fer-  
guson have been appointed Judges for  
holding said election, and Waldo  
Green has been appointed Registrar  
for said election.

that a new registration has  
been ordered for said election and  
that the Registration Books will be  
open for the registration of voters  
on the 24th day of April, 1926, and  
will close Saturday, the 15th day of  
May, 1926, and the said registration

place on Saturdays; Saturday before  
the election will be Challenge Day.

At said election those who are in  
favor of the levying and collection  
of the tax, shall vote a ticket on which  
shall be written or printed the words,  
"FOR LOCAL TAX," and those who  
are opposed, shall vote a ticket on  
which shall be written or printed the  
words, "AGAINST LOCAL TAX."

Said election shall be held in ac-  
cordance with an act entitled: "AN  
ACT TO AMEND THE CONSOLI-  
DATED STATUTES AND TO CODI-  
FY THE LAWS RELATING TO  
PUBLIC SCHOOLS," ratified at the  
1923 session of the General Assembly  
and also acts amendatory thereto,  
and pursuant to the General Election  
Laws.

**RESOLUTION ORDERING STREET  
IMPROVEMENT UPON A POR-  
TION OF MAIN STREET.**

Be it Resolved by the Mayor and  
Board of Aldermen of the Town  
of Hazelwood.

Section 1. That pursuant to Chap-  
ter 85, Private Laws of 1921, Extra  
Session, a local improvement as here-  
in described shall be made upon Main  
Street from the corporation line at  
the old Hyatt Mill site near the res-  
idence of M. J. McCracken running  
in an easterly direction to State  
Highway No. 10.  
Laying a pavement of concrete, 6  
inches thick, upon a foundation of  
earth, all being 18 to 30 feet wide  
and extending from curb to curb.  
Grading Between Curbs.

Laying a concrete curb and gutter  
on both sides of the street. Curb to  
be 6" wide 12" deep, gutter 2" wide  
and 6" deep.

Providing necessary drainage,  
drainage inlets, catch basins and man-  
holes for sewers.

Section 2. That one-fourth of the  
total cost of said improvement shall  
be assessed upon the lots and parcels  
of lands abutting on the South Side  
thereof and one-fourth of said total  
cost shall be assessed upon the lots  
and parcels of land abutting on North  
side thereof, all according to the ex-  
tent of their respective frontages  
thereon, and the assessment so made  
shall be payable in ten equal annual  
installments, with interest at 6% per  
annum from the date of confirma-  
tion of said assessment, unless the  
owner of any property so assessed  
shall desire to pay the same in cash,  
without interest, before the expira-  
tion thirty days after the first pub-  
lication of a notice to be given under  
Section 8 of said Chapter, stating  
that such assessment may be paid  
in cash.

Section 3. That said improvement  
shall be made pursuant to contract.

Section 4. That the owners of all  
property abutting on the portion of  
said street so to be improved are  
hereby directed to connect their  
several premises with water mains  
and sewer pipes located and to be  
located in the street adjacent to  
their respective premises in accord-  
ance with plans and specifications  
for such connections now on file in  
the office of the Town Clerk, and the  
Board of Aldermen will cause such  
connections to be made in any case in  
which the same shall not be made  
before May 20, 1926, and the cost of  
each connection so made shall be a  
charge upon the premises connected  
and the owner thereof.

Section 5. That a certain ordinance  
or resolution passed March 2, 1926,  
having no title or caption, but pur-  
porting to ordain and resolve that  
the part of Main Street herewith  
described should be improved, be and  
the same is hereby repealed.

Section 6. This resolution shall be  
in force upon its passage.

mously adopted and passed at a  
meeting of the Mayor and Board of  
Aldermen, held this the 26th day of

**RESOLUTION ORDERING SIDE-  
WALK IMPROVEMENT UPON  
A PORTION OF MAIN STREET**

Be it Resolved by the Mayor and  
Board of Aldermen of the Town  
of Hazelwood.

Section 1. That pursuant to Chap-  
ter 85, Private Laws of 1921, Extra  
Session, a local improvement as here-  
in described shall be made upon both  
sides ("upon the S. side") of Main  
Street from Virginia Avenue running  
in an easterly direction to State  
Highway No. 10.  
Laying a sidewalk of concrete 4  
inches thick, upon a foundation of  
earth, all being 5 feet wide.  
Grading for said sidewalk.

Section 2. That one-half of the total  
cost of said improvement shall be  
assessed upon the lots and parcels of  
land abutting directly on said im-  
provement, all according to the extent  
of their respective frontages thereon,  
and the assessment so made shall be  
payable in ten equal annual install-  
ments, with interest at 6% per an-  
num from the date of confirmation of  
said assessment, unless the owner of  
any property so assessed shall de-  
sire to pay the same in cash, without  
interest, before the expiration of  
thirty days after the first publication  
of a notice to be given under section  
8 of said Chapter, stating that such  
assessment may be paid in cash.

Section 3. That said improvement  
shall be made pursuant to contract.

Section 4. That a certain ordinance  
or resolution passed March 2, 1926,  
having no title or caption, but pur-  
porting to ordain and resolve that the  
part of Main Street herewith de-  
scribed should be improved, be and  
the same is hereby repealed.

Section 5. This resolution shall be  
in force upon its passage.

erecting, enlarging, altering and  
equipping school buildings and pur-  
chasing sites in said District, or for  
any one or all of said purposes.
