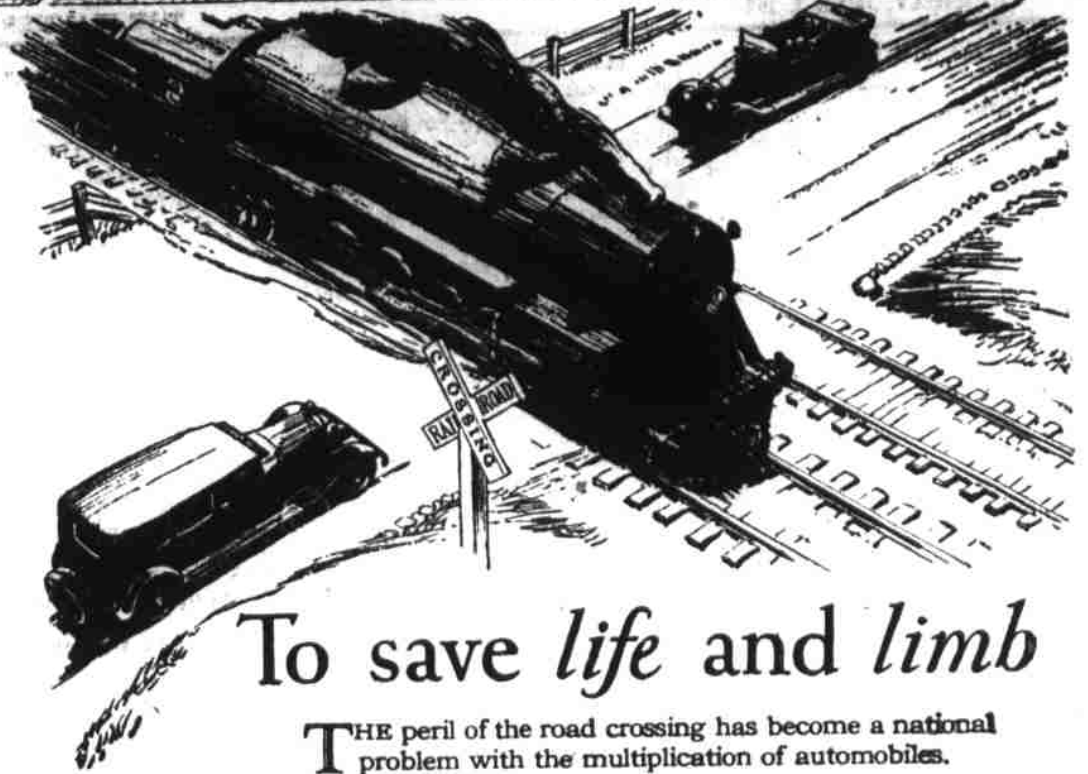

probably half as much as the cost to build the railroads.

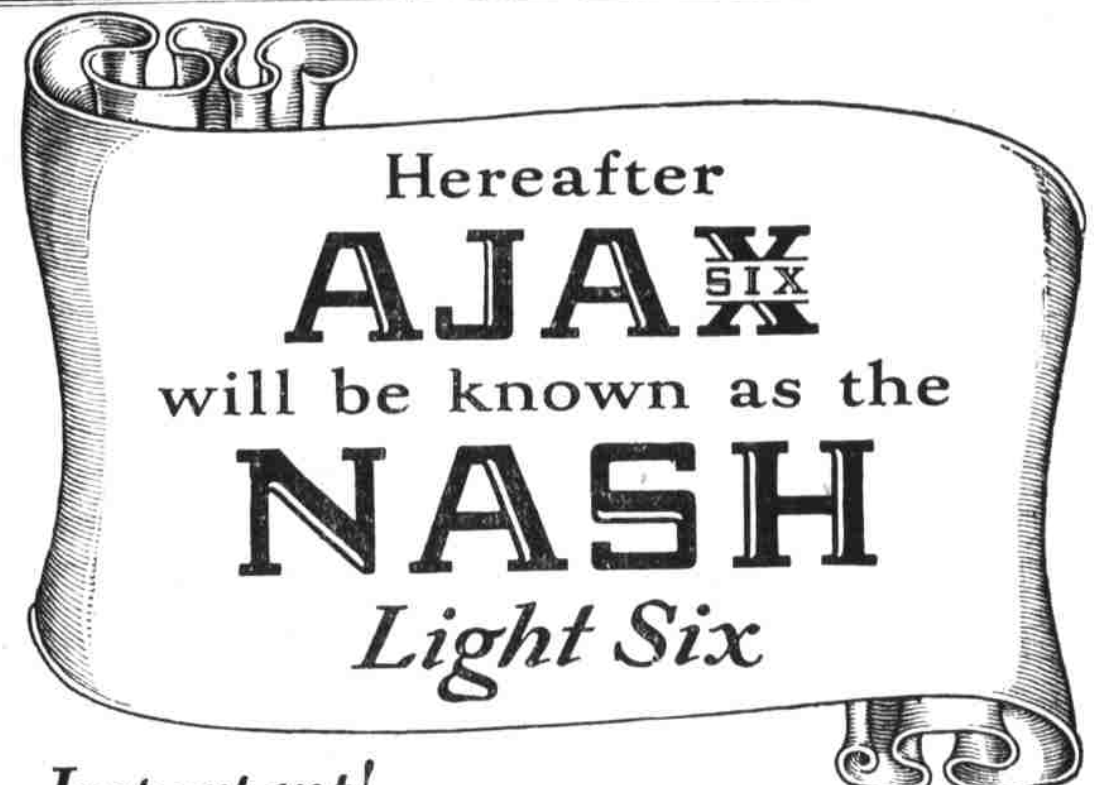
Even if the money were available, and the public willing
