**SOME HAPPENINGS AROUND DURHAM.**

Durham, Aug. 23.—Movement for five-county tuberculosis hospital to take care of patients in Durham and surrounding counties has been started. Orange county physicians having discussed the proposal with Durham physicians. Legislative action is expected to result, by which such a hospital can be built, causing a saving to the counties entering the arrangement.

Ernest F. Walker, in whose veins runs white, colored and Indian blood, waived preliminary examination in Recorder's court Friday and was held without bond for the October 11 term of Durham county Superior court on three of the four capital offenses in North Carolina courts; murder, burglary and rape (criminal assault.) Walker confessed to police that he entered the home of James Cassidy, negro, on Sunday night, July 25, Cassidy and his wife were sleeping, struck Cassidy with an axe, from which he died a few days later, and assaulted his wife. Police say they have never before heard of such a group of crimes in this state. Arson is the only other capital offense.

The American Business club, a luncheon organization composed of young men and operating similar to the Rotary, Kiwanis, Lions, Civitans and other civic clubs, has been formed in Durham with James R. Patton, Democratic nominee for county recorder, as president. The A. B. C. is a national organization. Asheville, Greensboro and Raleigh have clubs.

Answer to the petition filed with the alleged will of the late Mark Hopkins, California multi-millionaire and native of North Carolina, in California this month, has been forwarded by Judge J. H. Longden, representing 205 North Carolina claimants to participation in the \$300,000-000 estate in which it is denied that Mark Hopkins left a will, that the will filed for probate is a forgery and request is made that an administrator be appointed to find the value of the estate and a commissioner be named to ascertain the relationship of the North Carolina claimants to Mark Hopkins, then that the estate be redistributed on that basis, giving the rightful heirs their part. Judge Longden left Saturday for San Francisco to appear in the hearing set for August 30 and oppose the probating of the alleged will.

Ira Goss, check clerk for the Seaboard and Norfolk Southern railroads and stationed at the Liggitt & Myers Tobacco Co. loading platform, was held for higher court in the Recorder's court last week on charges of larceny of cases of cigarettes and selling them to stores and cafes in Durham and along the road toward Greensboro. His bond was fixed at \$1,000, while that of Oscar Plumlee, who operates a cafe and was also charged with larceny of cigarettes, was placed at \$500. S. F. Pope, also a cafe operator, was held under \$300 bond as a material witness. Ten or 12 cases valued at \$64 each had disappeared within the preceding ten days and 40 or 50 cases were missing during the three or four months, it was offered in evidence.

Condemnation proceedings have been started against a small strip of land owned by W. E. Rigbee and located near the new baseball park by the city of Durham, in order to permit opening Geer street for a short distance, thus giving another outlet to the Durham-Oxford highway, just about completed. The owner issued warning and threatened arrest of any trespasser on the property, when the city got its steam shovel ready to begin leveling the strip. The condemnation proceedings, though causing some delay, were decided upon by the city attorney.
