### Motorists Must Carry Registration Card At All Times, New Law

Motorists will save themselves considerable embarrassment and inconvenience by carrying their white registration pocket card with them at all times while operating a motor vehicle.

"Due to the fact that North Carolina automobile license plates for 1932 will bear no classification symbol it will be necessary for the highway patrol and other officers to frequently call on motor vehicle owners for their registration card," Mr. Roberts said.

Although the motor club executive urged that the card be in possession of the operator of the vehicle at all times he strongly opposes keeping the card in the car as possession of the card would hinder recovery of the vehicle in the event it was stolen.

"In addition to its value in determining ownership of a vehicle," Mr. Roberts said, "the pocket card is the operator's sole evidence that the correct license fee has been paid. This will be particularly valuable to operators of trucks as the card will show what weight load may be hauled on the particular vehicle."

Mr. Roberts urged that fleet owners impress on their operators the value of always carrying the registration card and also made a plea for truck owners who wish to carry heavier loads than the rated capacity to be certain and make known the overload and pay the correct fee when purchasing license.
