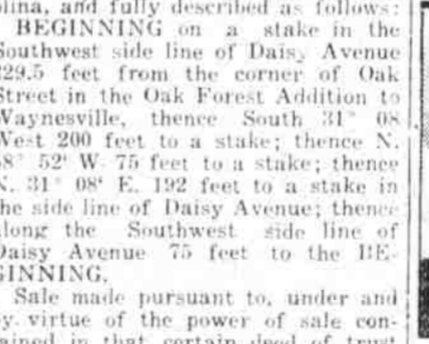

ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HAYWOOD COUNTY. 1. The bonds of the county shall be issued for the purpose of purchasing, constructing, erecting, and equipping a new courthouse and jail, and for the purpose of acquiring, either by purchase or condemnation any lands needed therefor, in a sum not to exceed thirty five thousand dollars.

2. That a tax, sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds, when due shall be annually levied and collected, that a statement of the County debt, for other than school purposes has been filed with the clerk and is open to public inspection.

3. That this order shall take effect thirty days after the first publication thereof, after final passage, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed, under the County Finance Act, and that in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election, as provided in the County Finance Act, pursuant to Chapter 214, Public Local Laws, 1921, an unforeseen emergency is hereby declared to exist.

On motion of Mr. Henderson and seconded by Mr. Allison, the foregoing order was unanimously adopted by roll-call vote. The following resolution was introduced and read to the Board: RESOLVE that the 4th day of January, 1932, at ten o'clock, A. M., is hereby fixed as the day and hour for hearing protests against the issuance of bonds pursuant to the bond order introduced December 7th, 1931.

On motion of Mr. Massey and seconded by Mr. Haynes, the foregoing resolution was unanimously passed by roll call vote.
