able assistance he has rendered the Chamber of Commerce in the past months. He will tell you how Waynesville and Lake Junaluska can pull together and accomplish fine things for the both of us. "We now have a big drawing card which we have not had before to offer prospective visitors, and that is the Great Smoky Mountain National Park which I believe will be much more valuable to us than any of us realize in the next few years, and this will, of course, make very interesting material for our booklet.

"However, we are not going to be satisfied with soliciting tourist patronage alone, but we are going to make a strong bid for all kinds of industries, and we want to play up our natural resources which would be advantageous to many kinds of industrial plants requiring plenty of good clean water power, electric

power, timber and minerals and satisfactory labor.

"We also have millions and millions of cords of wood and timber that can be converted into anything from a paper bag to a ladies' silk dress or a bedroom suite, and our labor is found to be very satisfactory and free from the organized labor strife and agitation prevalent in the North and East.

"Take for example the American Enka plant, over here in Buncombe county, Mr. Harvery Holleman, in charge of public relations at the plant, told me that they had twenty of these plants in almost as many countries and that this plant had made better progress and that the officials at the parent plant in Holland was better pleased with the splendid way this plant had developed more rapidly than any of the plants, and that they had often received compliments from the home office on the fine spirit and co-operation of its employees.

"I believe Mr. Colkitt of the Hazel-Wayne Tapestry Mill at Hazelwood, will also tell you that one of the foremost reasons they decided to locate one of their units here was to get away from the labor troubles they were having in New Jersey.

"So with all these desirable things to offer prospects of the industrial world, what we need, as I see it, is a 'live, wide awake' Chamber of Commerce to keep on the job and go after these things constantly through its committees appointed to handle this phase of the work.

"I'm sorry to say that there has been some criticism of the organization by some of our business men and some of our good citizens have gone so far as to say that they had no faith or interest in the Chamber of Commerce, but I feel sure they either were uninformed or have been misinformed as to its objects and activities, while, of course, our means have been limited and the organization can go only so far as the fund at its command will permit. However, I assure you it is absolutely an unselfish organization, the officials and workers giving their time willingly without one cent of remuneration, and the running expenses are kept down to the minimum, as our secretary will tell you this evening.

"Now let us see for a moment,-- Just who is the Chamber of Commerce, is it Ernest Withers, Major Howell or myself --No, I'll tell you who it is, it's you and I and every citizen of this community who has our town and community at heart as we should have, and just to that end we will succeed in making it what it could and should. I expect every business man and woman, every professional man and every individual in Waynesville, Hazelwood and Lake Junaluska to stand by me and the other officials and back us up in every possible way.
