Corn Planting Test Completed By W. D. Smith At School

Valuable Information Revealed By Different Planting Methods

Holcomb Profile Corn was grown in 10 plots in the school garden under supervision of W. D. Smith, teacher of vocational agriculture.

Plots and Fertilizers Per Acre

Table with 3 columns: Plot No., Fertilizer, Per Acre. Includes plots 1 through 5 with various fertilizer combinations like Chilean Nitrate, Acid Phosphate, and Muriate Potash.

In each case above, when nitrate of soda was used it was applied to the corn when from knee to waist high. Most farmers of Haywood County use the fertilizer and methods of plots No. 1 and 3.

On the fertilizer test all the mineral was furnished by the Chilean Nitrate of Soda people through Mr. James Gray of Raleigh.

More than 75 boys and farmers estimated the yield on these plots just before harvesting. The boys proved to be the winners.
