Several days she had been ill with a slight attack of pneumonia. On Thursday she was thought to have passed the crisis of her illness and even was thought she was improving. About 1:30 o'clock Friday morning, she began to develop pneumonia in both lungs and within a few hours was apparently ill again. She was taken to the Haywood County Hospital where no effort on the part of nurses and physicians was spared in an effort to save her life.

Mrs. Thackston was formerly Miss Eula Claire Kelley, a member of one of the finest families of central Carolina. She came from Charlotte to Waynesville about twenty-five years ago, and immediately became connected with some of the leading professional firms of the city as secretary.

Throughout her entire life she was deeply devoted to the various organizations, institutions and movements that had for their ultimate aim the building of a better community. Eager to have a part in the development of all worthwhile things she was at the call of any one when her service was needed in almost every field of endeavor.

Mrs. Thackston is survived by her husband, Ira H. Thackston, one daughter, Miss Louisa Thackston, a member of the junior class of the Waynesville High School, two sisters, Misses Georgia and Estelle Kelley and one brother, James Kelley of Charlotte.
