

### Ehringhaus Heard By Large Audience Here Last Thursday

stand squarely behind the present highway law of the State. I believe this was one of the wisest acts of the last General Assembly and has meant tremendous saving to the State."

Mr. Ehringhaus also is in favor of the State taking over as part of the highway system streets which are a part of the highway system but which are now kept up by the cities and towns through which they pass.

Mr. Ehringhaus, in speaking of this change in the highway regulations, declared that the residents of the cities paid their part of the gasoline tax and therefore should have a part of the tax used on the streets for their upkeep, which actually belong to and form a part of the State highway system.

"I believe the 15-cent tax levy by counties for the support of schools should be removed," Mr. Ehringhaus said. "I am in favor of the State paying all the cost of the six months school and relieving the counties of any tax whatsoever in this connection. "We certainly can't neglect our educational activities. I think that no greater wrong can be done to the poor man than to do away with the public schools."

Mr. Ehringhaus referred to the campaign of his opponent, Lieutenant Governor R. T. Fountain, and declared that he could not understand Mr. Fountain's criticism of an administration of which he was a part. He also referred to the fact that Mr. Fountain was a part of the last General Assembly and must himself stand or fall on the acts of that party.

#### Not An Expert

Mr. Ehringhaus said that he didn't want the people of North Carolina to feel that he was an expert for he never held a political office. He further said that he was just one of the people and not an expert in political life. He said that he would not let any large interest, individual, corporation, or any one tend to influence him in any way other than that of which he conscience was clear, if he was elected governor.

Mr. Ehringhaus said that one of the things that would pull people out of the depression is "reevaluation downward and not revaluation upward." Mr. Ehringhaus said that he believed that all property should be given in for what it might bring sometime. He was emphatic in his belief that only by a return to the rigid economy that was practiced in bygone days could the State hope to bring about a return to prosperity. This was in connection with governmental expenditures.

Justice lived about 2 hours after firing the fatal shot, which entered the back of his head on the right side and passed out just above the left ear. Sheriff Lowe found several letters on Mr. Justice, but refused to disclose the contents as they dealt with Kinsland and the shooting of Mrs. Cook. Just what part, if any, that Kinsland had in the Friday shooting, was not given out from the sheriff's office Wednesday afternoon. The letters found on Mr. Justice must have a direct connection with the Friday billing, it was pointed out by those that have kept in close touch with details of the case held at the Clyde cemetery sometime Thursday afternoon, it was said.

Mrs. Cook was well known in the county. She was a sister of Dr. Abel of this city. She was buried last Saturday afternoon at Canton.

### Cars In Haywood Show Decrease Over Last Year, Report Shows

Haywood county citizens owned 1675 automobiles and 375 trucks on April 1st, as compared with 1750 automobiles and 315 trucks on April 1st, 1931. It is shown by a compilation made in the office of L.S. Harris, director of the Motor Vehicle Bureau. The average for each of the 100 counties April 1st of this year was 2,579 automobile and 484 trucks, as compared with 2,986 automobiles and 422 trucks on April 1st, 1931.

North Carolinians had a total of 306,339 motor vehicles at the beginning of this month, including 257,898 automobiles and 48,441 trucks. The total number of about 34,000 less than the 340,838 motor vehicles licensed in the State a year ago. While the number of automobiles dropped from 298,623 a year ago to 257,898 at the beginning of this month, the number of trucks showed an increase from 42,215 a year ago to 48,441 at the beginning of this month.

The report shows that 1,650 of the automobiles and 770 of the trucks licensed in the State are owned by non-residents, while 656 motorcycles are in operation.
