EXCERPT FROM RADIO AT WINSTON-SALEM March 16, 1932.

Every state and every nation globe is today struggling with identical social and economic conditions that agitate the public mind. Governments are groping in darkness, vain to find a ray of light, lead to a brighter day. I have a profound conviction that the way out. First, governments and individuals must program of rigid economy, the unnecessary and superfluous must be eliminated. It is not enough to save. It is not enough to point where the pain is to death.

It is preposterous to think people of this nation can go without a quick revival in agriculture and industry—the fundamental prosperity and the backbone of our life. As evidence of this, all the candidates for office in this state are committed to the removal of the 15c tax levy for the support of the school. This tax relief is an admission of the dire straits of our state and yet when we are relieved we find that it only a saving of a dollar and taxes on every thousand dollars of property listed for taxation not enough. We must do more. We must reduce taxes in a sensible way. We must cut government to actual necessities. We must discontinue every non-public service, and yet I tell you all this has been done. We have scratched the surface of our ills. If we were to levy on all, discontinue all public services, our schools and colleges, to the primitive state, the this country would inevitably bankruptcy if agriculture and continue in its present stagnation and ruin. In other words, we are never going to move out of our present economic straits unless we have eight million Americans in idleness, as long as we can find no markets, the farmers of this country are pelted to sell their tobacco at prices, their cotton below production, their corn bushel, their wheat at 1 1/2c a pound, truck and live stock at prices to supply the bare necessities of life.
