COUNTY CONSOLIDATIONS

Increasing interest in the consolidation of counties, as indicated by news items and editorials in numerous Southern papers, promotes hope that a reasonable time many meagers actually may be affected and the burden of the tax payer be tremendously relieved. As disclosed by the Manufacturers Record on January 29, 1931, there were then 1503 counties in the southern states, in a national total of 4072. Several consolidations in the South and other sections have since been accomplished; but, inviting opportunity still is open.

Of approximately \$14,000,000,000 in governmental expenditures in the United States in 1931, local governments used 59 percent, the states 18

per cent and the Federal Government the balance in round numbers total of \$7,200,000,000 expended by local agencies virtually balance Federal and states' totals. An indication of the huge savings for saving through consolidations is conspicuous in the Campbell counties will reduce payers' bill by some \$100,000. On the same basis, reducing South's 1500 counties to 1000 mean an annual savings of \$100,000,000.—Manufacturers Record.
