

50 Peaks In Park Over Mile High

Clingman's Dome is Highest In Park, Being 6612 Feet High; Many Over 6000 Feet.

Measurements completed the past year by the United States Geological Survey have shown that fifty named peaks, mountains and high altitudes gaps in the Smokies reach a height greater than a mile above sea level. The peaks reaching more than 6,000 feet in height number 26, with 23 peaks less than 6,000, but more than one mile in height. Eight gaps are located in the Smokies with elevations higher than one mile.

These high elevations account in great measure for the beautiful scenic attractions of the Park; the high waterfalls, towering peaks, sheer cliffs dropping away abruptly, stupendous mountain bulks separated by deep gulfs and wide-spreading valley floors, tumbling creeks and rivers.

Smoky Mountains peaks above 6,000 feet high, and those less than 6,000, but greater than one mile follow:

BRIEF NEWS ITEMS

Farmers of Lincoln County are planting an increased acreage to spring oats due to unfavorable conditions for sowing small grain last fall.

Planting of bespedeza in Rutherford County increased from 140 acres in 1929 to 1,499 acres in 1932, according to facts gathered by the county farm agent.

Thirty-four Caswell County farmers saved \$250 by cooperating to purchase cows used for tuberculosis and 25 head for abortion by a competent veterinarian.

Eighty-five per cent of the \$8,962.50 loaned to 226 farmers in Alexander County from the Government seed loan fund has been repaid.
