50 Peaks In Park Over Mile High

Clingman's Dome is Highest In Park, Being 6612 Feet High; Many Over 6000 Feet.

Measurements completed the past year by the United States Geological Survey have hown that lifty name, peaks mountains and high altitude gaps in the Smokies reach a height greater than a mile above sea level.

The peaks reaching more than 6,000 feet in height number 20, with 23 peaks less than 6,000, but more than one mile in height. Eight gaps are located in the Smokies with elevations higher than one mile.

These high elevations account in great measure for the beautiful scenic attractions of the Park; the high waterfalls, towering peaks, sheer eliffs dropping away abruptly, stupendous mountain bulks separated by deep gulfs and wide-spreading valley floors, tumbling creeks and rivers.
