No Soft Pedal Used At Funeral Conducted By Old Preacher

Preacher in Monroe Told Truth At Funeral Regardless Of Outcome

It is interesting to note that the Mountaineer has the following to say about a preacher who conducted a funeral in a rather odd manner:

There lived a preacher in the section a few years ago who was much talked of as the famous Jimmy Little used to be there. This man was named Stubbs, and he was an Elder in the Union Baptist church from about the age of 20, till his death at some 84 or 85 years. He was a large man of commanding appearance and had a coarse voice that was not unlike that of my old friend W. P. Plyler of Mt. Pleasant. That he was rather plain spoken you may gather from the following story of his preaching:

He was called upon to preach the funeral of one of that section's wealthiest citizens who had not been to his neighbors all that a good neighbor should be. He had been accused of cheating the negroes on his place of moving the land, cakes of these his land joined and cutting trees on the land of others. So in his last days he left the request that Elder Stubbs be called on to preside at the funeral. The old preacher got up when it came time to make his comment and started the congregation by saying: "I suppose I am expected to say that this man has been a good man, but he has not, and I'm not going to say so here or nowhere else. I think he is gone as straight to hell as a martin ever went to it, guard and according to what I know of his life, he is getting about what he deserves."

The same old preacher was called to preach the funeral of another man in the same community whose children had secured all of the old man's property and money and had promptly set him out at the poor house. Elder Stubbs paid a just tribute to the deceased and wound up his discourse, by saying to the old man's children who had abandoned him: "There you sit, weeping and crying; crying for what? More money, I suppose. Every single one of you who has a tear in his eye ought to be 'aken out and horse-whipped." And added: "If there is a just God, He will take from you that which you took from your old broken down father." These people still live over in Bulloch county.

Elder Stubbs was a man who could give a quick and positive answer. When he was asked what he thought of the heavenly chances of an old fellow who had been rather tipsy before the preacher some days before, he replied with his rather gruff voice: "Well he was not going that way the last time I saw him" pointing up.

"Did I hear you say, conductor, that the locomotive was at the rear of the train?"

"Yes, ma'am. We've got a locomotive at each end. It takes an extra one to push up the mountain."
