Raleigh. North Carolina during the first 11 months of this year bought nearly twice as many automobiles as during the same period of 1932 and sales in November were hearly three time, as great as in November last year.

1. S. Harris, director of the state motor vehicle bureau today reported 2,320 new passenger cars and 455 trucks or 2.775 vehicles, were sold in the state in November compared with 912 new cars and 188 trucks. or 1,100 vehicles in the month last

Thus far this year 26,963 new cars and 5.960 new trucks or 32.923 Vehicles, have been sold as compared with 14.166 new cars and 3.396 new trucks, or 17,512 vehicles for 11 months of 1932
