All Schools Of County Are Expected To Participate. Program Announced by M. H. Bowles

M. H. Bowles, superintendent of the Waynesville township schools, announced today that plans and the program had been completed for Haywood County Day.

The official program follows: 1. Exhibit all day, one room set aside in Waynesville Township High School for each of the four districts.

3. Strenuous, continuous, competitive, from either elementary or high school. Five minutes each.

8. Literary Contest: First place 20 points, Second place 12 points, Third place 5 points.

9. Music Contest: First place 10 points, Second place 7 points, Third place 4 points.
