Stage Is Set For "Ramp Convention" Next Sunday In Fines Creek Section

12th Annual Convention Will Be Held At Hannah Springs on Highway 209. Large Crowd Expected

Final plans have been made for the 12th annual "Ramp Convention" which is held each year in Fines Creek, or Hannah Springs near the Haywood-Madison county line. The date set this year by J. B. Davis, president, is Sunday, April 15th. The place where the convention is held is on highway 209 about twenty miles from Waynesville.

The ramp convention is somewhat like a large community picnic, except that the chief source of food is ramps. This is a plant similar to an onion and grows wild on certain mountainsides. Bread, meat and coffee are the usual necessities to the convention.

Each family, or group, builds their own fire and prepares their meat. A huge pot of coffee is usually served to all attending. Other than the preparation and serving of the meal, a social get-together in one of the homes of the conventions.

It is expected that a large crowd will be attracted to the convention, according to President "Uncle Jim" Davis. During the past few years interest in the ramp convention has grown to the point where people from Tennessee and other places almost a hundred miles away attend. In the event of rain the convention is held on the following Sunday.

Mr. Davis said that every one is invited to attend, and that the convention site could not be missed if highway No. 209 is followed.
