Mrs. Jack Hinson, of Shelby, arrived Saturday for a ten-day visit to her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Will Ray.

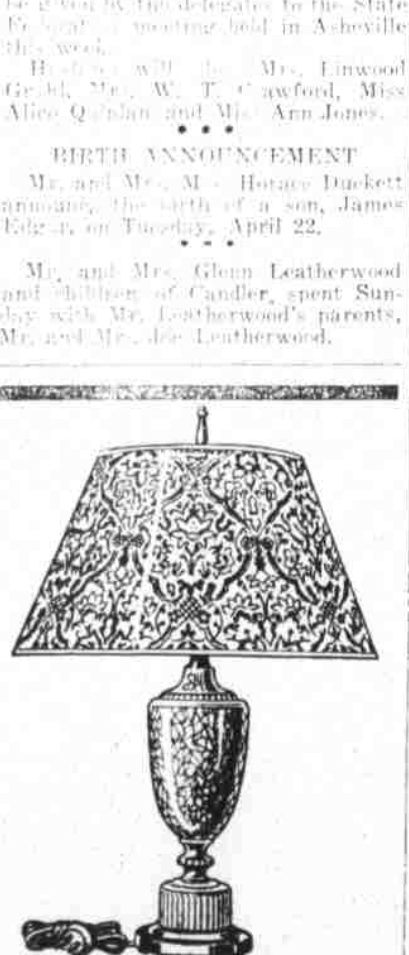
