LESS MILK USED WHEN NOT FRESH

The rapid souring of milk handled carelessly has been given as a chief reason why milk consumption is low on many farms.

Unsanitary and slightly soured milk is not palatable and it is easy to see why farm families whose milk is not cared for properly do not drink as much milk as they should...

To keep milk clean and fresh, it should be strained through at least three thicknesses of fine cheese cloth immediately after milking, Kimrey said.

When the bottle should be placed in the coldest water available and allowed to cool. The water should be changed as often as necessary to bring the milk rapidly to the temperature of the water.

On farms where ice is kept, the milk should be placed in the ice box after it has been cooled by water. Where ice is not kept, the milk should be left in cold water until it is to be used.

The cream can be poured from the bottles and kept for churning or other purposes. The rapid cooling of milk in bottles will cause the cream to rise more quickly and completely than is the case when milk is not cooled and where it is stored in large vessels, such as buckets or cans.

Milk thus handled is completely sealed from dust, odors, or other forms of contamination. It will be found much more convenient for the housewife to handle milk bottles, than in the usual way, Kimrey said.
