Chiffonade Dressing

To 1 teaspoon of salt, 1-4 teaspoon pepper and a dash of paprika add 12 tablespoons of salad oil and 3 tablespoons vinegar.

Russian Dressing

To 3-4 cup of mayonnaise add 1-2 of a hard boiled egg chopped fine, 1 tablespoon of chopped green pepper, 1 tablespoon of chopped chives, 1-3 cup of chili sauce.

Tartar Sauce

Chop fine 2 olives, 1 gherkin 1 tablespoon of parsley. Add 1 cup of mayonnaise. Mix well and serve with fried or broiled fish.

Vinaigrette Dressing

To 1 cup French dressing add 2 teaspoons chopped pickles, 2 teaspoons chopped capers, teaspoon each chopped parsley and onion, 1 teaspoon prepared mustard. Serve with lettuce and tomato salad.
